June Reflection - Ordinary Time

In June the church's calendar takes us into the green, growing weeks of Ordinary Time. The word 'ordinary' has faintly negative associations – it's commonplace, nothing special or distinctive - just ordinary. Though I guess that most of us are longing for days and ways that get us back to something more ordinary. The word has its roots in a Latin word which means 'order'. Ordinary Time means ordered or measured time. We have a season to recognise another kind of measuring, of noting what matters, what counts.

In Ordinary Time we are reminded of a simpler way. It requires courage. It invites us to be in the world with play and creativity. It calls us to seek after what is possible and be willing to learn and be surprised. The simpler way requires a



belief that there is an order to the world. It is there already and we do not need to organise it. The simpler way calls forth what is best about us. It ask us to understand human nature differently, more optimistically. It asks us to be less serious, yet more purposeful about our work and our lives. The hope is that this season and the past experience of pandemic times, will help us re-imagine a better way, a world where all may flourish.

May you be blessed by Ordinary Time and be ready to be surprised by the wonder of each ordinary moment



CROPREDY PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of a Virtual Meeting of Cropredy Parish Council held online on Monday 3rd May 2021 at 7pm

Prior to the meeting Cllr Johnson informed the meeting that, as nobody had been nominated to join the PC to fill the vacancy following the resignation of Bob Dunn, Karla Martin has offered her services. Ms Martin introduced herself and Cllr Knight proposed that she be appointed councillor and this was seconded by Cllr Smith and approved unanimously. Ms Martin signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office and took her place in the meeting.

In Attendance: County Cllr George Reynolds and District Cllr Phil Chapman.

- 1. ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN FOR ENSUING YEAR: Cllr Boscott proposed that Cllr Johnson be re-elected and this was seconded by Cllr Smith and approved unanimously, Cllr Johnson then took the chair for the remainder of the meeting.
- **2. ELECTION OF VICE-CHAIRMAN FOR ENSUING YEAR:** Cllr Garland propose that Cllr Knight be re-elected Vice-Chairman and this was seconded by Cllr Smith and approved unanimously.
- **3. COMPOSITION OF WORKING GROUPS FOR COMING YEAR:** It was agreed that the working groups should remain basically the same:

Village Maintenance and Development: Cllr Jacqui Smith (Chairman) Cllr Tania Johnson Transport, Traffic and Street Lighting: Cllr Des Knight (Chairman) Cllr Margaret Boscott Planning, Finance and Legal: Cllr Bob Garland (Chairman) Cllr Tania Johnson Village Plan, Crime Prevention, Environment: Cllr Sheila Jones (Chairman) Cllr Tania Johnson The Chair also asked Cllr Martin to lead a new group on the PC's use of the internet and social media.

- 4. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE: were received from Kenneth Porter (Clerk).
- 5. **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST:** there were no declarations on this occasion.
- **6. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING** of 12th April 2021 were approved as a correct record to be signed by the Chair.
- **7. MATTERS ARISING:** there were no matters arising not covered elsewhere on the agenda.
- **8. REPORTS OF WORKING GROUPS: (i) Village Maintenance and Development** Cllr Knight reported that the damaged retaining wall in Hell Hole continues to be monitored without further deterioration being detected. A work party to carry out the first of two annual cuts in the lower Churchyard was proposed for 10May.
 - (ii) Transport and Traffic, Street Lighting and Trees Cllr Knight reported that he and Cllr Garland have had no further updates regarding the review of the three firm quotes for the construction of the proposed school car park. Cllr Knight has also reviewed the available signage to help communicate the "20's Plenty for Oxfordshire" campaign and is now trying to contact Jean Conway, the Campaign leader at OCC, for some guidance on how to initiate communication. He will also ask if there is another parish in the area which is having success with the campaign with a view to liaising for ideas. Cllr Knight has also placed an order with Nicholsons covering three of the six observations made in their 'Duty of Care' Tree Survey. The three are moderate risk observations and there is a fourth being reviewed with Oxfordshire Highways. The remaining two are low risk concerns that require attention in 12+ months.
 - (iii) Village Plan, Crime Prevention and Environment Cllr Jones reported that she has received six new requests for "No Cold Caller" signs.
 - (iv) Planning, Finance and Legal:

New Planning Applications: 21/01218/F — Old Dairy Farm, School Lane — replace existing farm buildings to provide 7 inclusive visitor accommodation units for disabled persons;

Decisions: - 20/03573/F & 20/03574/LB – Springfields, Station Road – replacement residential entrance porch – granted;

- 9. SPORTS & SOCIAL CLUB the Chair and Cllrs Garland and Knight held a brief review of the insurance arrangements with the SSC and the Chair will attend its AGM on 17 May and respond formally to Mr Wilson.
- **10. FINANCE** the Clerk's report had been submitted to councillors prior to the meeting and it was **resolved** that the payments itemised for £5964.48, of which £3683.84 is the annual insurance renewal, be authorised. The Clerk also reported that all the papers are currently with Janet Green who is completing the internal audit for the year ended 31 March 2021.
- **11.CLIMATE CHANGE GROUP** Cllr Garland reported the group had been busy working on matters such as tree planting and better cycle routes. A meeting had been held with the Marina manager to look at their recent tree and hedgerow planting. Cllr Garland proposed that Climate Change should be brought under the Planning working group to reflect its importance in CDC's current local plan review.
- **12. REPORT ON COUNTY COUNCIL MATTERS** County Cllr Reynolds reported that there may be money available from OCC for the "20s Plenty" signage and that officers are working to simplify the process for local communities.
- **13. REPORT ON DISTRICT COUNCIL MATTERS** District Cllr Chapman reported on a project to provide enhanced internet access for the Village Hall and he will be attending a meeting for an update shortly.
- 14. CORRESPONDENCE: OCC Emergency Planning; Covid Checklist for Events; OCC Highways consultation proposed disabled parking spaces inc. Cup & Saucer; CDC Cherwell Parish Bulletin; OALC April Members' Updates; Future PC meetings; OPFA Spring newsletter; CPRE monthly newsletters; Rural Services Network Rural Bulletins; Healthwatch Oxfordshire April Briefing; CAB thanks for donation to Volunteer Driver Service.
- 15. ANY OTHER BUSINESS NOT OF A CONFIDENTIAL NATURE the Chair explained plans to hold a PC/Village open weekend on 2 and 3 October and a sub-committee comprised of Cllrs Johnson, Martin and Garland will be formed to plan this. Cllr Garland also reported that a separate sub-committee of himself together with Cllrs Johnson and Knight had organised a rigorous recruitment process to replace Mr Porter, the Clerk, who is due to retire. The name of the new clerk will be announced shortly. Cllr Jones still has some of the "Message in a Bottle" containers for storing medical details and anybody wanting one should contact her; the Chair will ask the Lions for a further supply. Cllr Knight reported that he had been contacted by a parishioner about the bottle banks which were overflowing. The Chair explained that these are emptied regularly and there is a process to report if they become full in the interim and she will investigate further. The British Legion "Tommy" sign has arrived and will be installed below the Millennium Village sign.
- **16.ANY MATTERS RAISED BY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC ATTENDING THE MEETING** with no public in attendance there were no matters raised on this occasion.
- 17. DATE OF NEXT MEETING: Monday 14 June 2021 at 7pm I the Methodist Chapel.

There being no further matters the Chair closed the public meeting at 8.10pm.
