An illustrated talk by Dr Gill White

KATHERINE OF ARAGON

"The first wife". But what was she really like?

Katherine was a remarkable and capable woman who steered a complicated course through Tudor England for more than thirty years. Well educated, courageous and politically shrewd, she was loved by the people and was in most ways an excellent royal consort. But she failed in one thing: to provide her husband, King Henry VIII, with a son and heir.



Dr White tells Katherine's largely forgotten story, from childhood in the palaces of Spain, through her short-lived first marriage, her traumatic fight for survival as a young widow, her triumphant second marriage and the catastrophe of "The King's Great Matter" that saw her set aside in favour of Anne Boleyn.

Gill White is one of our frequent and popular speakers. She has informed and entertained us with the histories of the Field of the Cloth of Gold, Robert Dudley's carnival at Kenilworth Castle for Elizabeth I, portraits of Queen Victoria, the Great Fire of Warwick, and the biographies of Bess of Hardwick, Mary Queen of Scots and most recently the 1st Duke of Devonshire, William Cavendish, builder of Chatsworth House.






