Covid-19 legislation has now been removed in England as we move into 'Step 4' of the government's roadmap. There are a number of recommendations and "notes of caution", as we continue to 'live with the virus' and continue to remember our responsibility of care for one another. The legal restrictions on numbers attending for baptisms, weddings and funerals have been removed. We will be following guidance from the national church and the Diocese of Oxford, and adopting a careful process of resuming various elements of worship that have had to be discontinued or adapted. How do you like to spend your summer break? This year, again, it will look different, as we continue to live in pandemic times, living with care for others and for ourselves. Whether you are staying home, or exploring a little further afield – what do you need? Some adventure and action, or time looking out on rolling hills or flowing river? Doing or being? There's a story in the Bible about two sisters from Bethany, Martha and Mary. When their friend Jesus comes to visit, Martha busies herself in the kitchen, doing her job of getting things ready, doing her work of

welcome. Her sister Mary sits down and listens to what Jesus has to say. Martha is cross that her work isn't being recognised and her sister doesn't attempt to help. I've got a lot of sympathy with Martha, and the story is often presented as one way is better than the other. In fact, when you delve a little deeper into the language, this is a radical

story in which Jesus is reminding both Mary and Martha to stay with their own distinctive ministries, their own God-given being. In reality we are both Martha and Mary from time to time. We need the blessing of both - of welcome and listening, makers and dreamers, service and being served, action and reflection. May you find the wholeness and the re-creation you need this summertime.



CROPREDY PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of a meeting of Cropredy Parish Council held in the Methodist Chapel on Monday 12th July 2021 at 7pm

Present: Councillors Tania Johnson (Chairman), Margaret Boscott, Bob Garland, Sheila Jones, Des Knight, Karla Martin, Jacqui Smith, District Cllr Phil Chapman and David Best (Clerk). Six members of the public attended the meeting.

Before the meeting commenced a presentation was made to Ken Porter who retired as Clerk after 16 years' service. The current Chairman and a previous Chairman gave speeches thanking Ken for his hard work, sound advice and support to the Council and Cropredy over many years.

- 1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE: County Cllr George Reynolds
- 2. **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST:** there were no declarations of interest.
- 3. **MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING** The minutes of the meeting of 14th June were approved as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.
- 4. MATTERS ARISING: None.
- 5. REPORTS OF WORKING GROUPS:
 - Village Maintenance and Improvement The repair of the lip between the tarmac and the skateboard ramp is still being investigated. The undergrowth at the side of the play area will be cut back at the end of the summer before the fencing is carried out. Mr Clive Porter has carried out another cut of the Churchyard grass. A 3rd cut is planned at the end of August and the last cut in October. The number of cuts required will be reviewed at the end of the season. Book shelter sheds start from £700-900 without a base. In addition, there is an offer for books to be located in the Church and the Church Rooms, accessible when the Post Office is open, but with the potential for longer opening hours if volunteer librarians could be recruited. It was agreed that it would be good to provide some book storage near the teenage shelter complemented by the other locations. A village clean-up was started on 12th July but interrupted by rain. Areas that still require a clean up include Hell Hole, Red Lion Street, Churchyard trees and the canal bridge. A member of the public attending the meeting offered to clean the white posts along Station Rd. A vote of thanks was given to Chris and Jo Jennings for clearing trees and undergrowth in the Churchyard. Nicholson Nurseries had invoiced for some tree surgery before the work was carried out, but payment not made until the work had been completed. The resident who mowed Vicarage Gardens has moved from the village so a new volunteer will need to be found. Cllr Johnson is attending a play area inspection course which is being run by the Oxfordshire Playing Fields Association.
 - ii. **Transport, Traffic and Street Lighting** It was agreed to progress with the quote from Mr Petre for construction of the school car park subject to further discussions relating to ensuring the conditions (e.g. design and construction) of the planning permission are met, and finalising the 'agreement' between Mr Petre, the School and the PC. It is hoped that the work could commence in September. Matters should be clearer after the Cherwell District Council's decision on the separate planning application from Mr Petre for for 7 visitor units for disabled people. Oxfordshire County Council has advised of a further delay to repairs of the footbridge until Spring 2022. It was agreed that the Clerk would request assurance form OCC that it is safe to continue using it and keep chasing for the work to be completed. It was agreed to prioritise investigation of the speed initiatives in the order of 1st Speed Watch, 2nd Chicanes, 3rd 20's Plenty Campaign. It was agreed that Cllr Knight and the Clerk would accept the offer from Hornton Parish Council to demonstrate the Speed Watch equipment that they own and seek interest from neighbouring Parish Councils to partner Cropredy in the scheme. There is an issue of cars parking on dangerous sections of the roads in the village. Incidents should be reported to the Police who will take action with cars parked dangerously.

- iii. **Village Emergency Plan, Crime Prevention and Environment** The Emergency Plan has been circulated to Councillors after updates were completed.
- iv. Parish Council use of internet and social media Cllr Martin has built the foundations of a new website. It is easier to build a new website than modify the existing one. A Facebook page will be linked to the website and used to advise parishioners of more urgent and topical things. Hugh Brooman, who runs the current website, is happy to hand over responsibility for the website. The PC is grateful to Hugh Brooman for his work on the Village Website and he will thanked formally in due course.
- v. **Planning, Climate Change, Finance and Legal** Cllr Garland advised that the next stage in the consultation on the Cherwell Local Plan appears to have been delayed, but he would be ready to engage with the next round of consultations.

6. **SPORTS AND SOCIAL CLUB** – It was reported that some cables to exterior lights may need replacing following PAT testing. A meeting is being scheduled between the Sports and Social Club and the Parish Council.

7. Finance

- i. It was RESOLVED that payments totalling £1,071.17 be authorised (unanimous)
- ii. All the forms and documents have been signed and returned to Unity Trust Bank and it is hoped that the account will be opened by the end of July.
- iii. Long Term Budget A number of possible items of expenditure in the next few years have been identified. The clerk will produce a long term budget to which further expenditure items can be added.
- 8. **COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT** None
- 9. **DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT** District Councillor Phil Chapman advised that CDC will shortly be consulting on whether to continue issuing planning notification letters to neighbouring properties as well as displaying a notice near to the site of the applicant. It was agreed that the priority should be to continue to send letters to neighbouring properties. He also reported that the Castle Quay II development was progressing well and that the development around the canal looks good.
- 10. **CORRESPONDENCE** The Clerk had distributed the correspondence as it had been received during the month. Cropredy Surgery has written requesting a recommendation of where to park 2-6 staff cars as it is hoped to install a portacabin in the car park to provide additional office space.
- 11. ANY OTHER BUSINESS NOT OF A CONFIDENTIAL NATURE A decision on the purchase of Queen's Platinum Jubilee mugs will be taken at a meeting before the end of the year. There will be a fringe Fairport event at The Brasenose Arms and a Fairport Convention concert on August 5th. Some concerns have been raised about parking, but it is understood that CDC is going to put some cones in the road and there may be arrangements for off-site parking. It was agreed that the Clerk would contact CDC asking for confirmation that the event will properly controlled and managed. The information sheet that has been distributed around the village has some changes. It was agreed that the information sheet would be put on the new website and updated through the year so that it will be up to date when next printed.
- 12. **ANY MATTERS RAISED BY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC** A member of the public advised that the 30mph sign on the Williamscot road was obscured by undergrowth. This will be cut back.
- 13. DATE OF THE NEXT MEETING Monday 9th August 2021

There being no further matters the Chair closed the public meeting at pm.8.42
