



CROPREDY PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of a meeting of Cropredy Parish Council held in the Methodist Chapel on Monday 9th August 2021 at 7pm

Present: Councillors Tania Johnson (Chairman), Margaret Boscott, Bob Garland, Sheila Jones, County Cllr George Reynolds, District Cllr Phil Chapman and David Best (Clerk). Two members of the public attended the meeting.

Before the meeting commenced a presentation was made to Bob Dunn who retired as Chairman of the Parish Council after 25 years' service. The current Chairman gave a speech thanking Bob for his commitment to the Council all his hard work, his dedication to support Cropredy and enhance the quality of life of its residents over many years.

- 1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE: Cllrs Des Knight, Karla Martin, Jacqui Smith
- 2. **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST:** there were no declarations of interest.
- 3. **MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING** The minutes of the meeting of 12th July were approved as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.
- 4. MATTERS ARISING: None.
- 5. VILLAGE MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT

Village Clean up - Two areas of the village that have been cleaned up since the last meeting are Hell Hole and Red Lion Street. Whilst cleaning up Hell Hole, the damaged retaining wall looked as if further deterioration had occurred. Photographic evidence has been sent to Tony Brummell (Building Control Manager – CDC) and he has scheduled a further inspection week commencing 9th August.

Headstones - There are a number of headstones in the Upper Churchyard that are currently wrapped in blue plastic and are kept beneath a tree. An approach has been made to the Cropredy P.C.C. and they have agreed to move these headstones into the church to be displayed in the Ladies Chapel. Cllr Knight is liaising with Verna Wass to schedule the move that will be overseen by Stephen Wass.

Play Area Inspection Training - The Chairman and Clerk attended a playground inspection course organised by the Oxford Playing Fields Association. Weekly inspections of the playground Cup and Saucer Play Area will be carried out using a checklist.

Zip Wire at playground - Cllr Boscott advised that the Zip Wire needs to be checked. The Playsafety Ltd annual inspection has just been carried out and it was agreed that the section on the Zip Wire would be circulated to all Councillors.

Books at Teenage Shelter - It was agreed to move some of the books from the Teenage Shelter into the Church. An additional shelter to keep the books next to the shelter in being investigated.

Mowing around the village - The Council expressed thanks to Benda & Stephen Day and all the volunteers who mow around the village. It is requested that anyone wishing to volunteer to help keep the village tidy and clean to contact one of the Councillors. Chapel Green has been strimmed by Oxfordshire County Council.

Water leaks around the village - Thames Water has been contacted to request that more permanent water main repairs are carried out. They advised that the are replacing the oldest pipes in the Thames Valley Area, starting with London, so it will be many years before the system in Cropredy will be updated. They will continue to respond to leaks as soon as possible. If a leak is spotted either ring Thames Valley or 'Fix My Street' on the Cherwell District Council website.

Cropredy Village Sign - It was reported that the Cropredy village sign along the Mollington Road has been stolen. It was agreed that the Clerk will ask Cherwell District Council for a replacement. Cllr Knight is also making enquiries.

6. TRANSPORT, TRAFFIC & STREET LIGTING

SpeedWatch Initiative — Sue Leech (Hornton Parish Council) carried out a demonstration of their SpeedWatch camera equipment on Saturday 30th July. It was held at a known hot spot in Cropredy along Claydon Road adjacent to Kyetts Corner and attended by Cllr Knight, Clerk Best, District Cllr Chapman and Clerk Bowen from the Bourtons Parish Council. Following the successful demonstration, a formal quote for the SpeedWatch Kit was received from Traffic Technology Ltd of £2,030excl VAT. A consortium of 4PC's would share the cost with each PC having the equipment for 2 weeks in an 8 week period. The Bourtons PC will be discussing this initiative at their meeting on 11th August, Sibford Ferris have shown some interest. Clerk Best and District Cllr Chapman are contacting other PC's that might be interested.

Car parking on bend outside The Brasenose Arms - The issue of parked traffic on the bend outside The Brasenose Arms public house has been raised with Thames Valley Police. They are planning a site visit but no feedback has been received yet. There is a regular liaison meeting scheduled with the Police in mid-August, so if we should not receive any feedback in the meantime, it can be raised then. This has been reported to Thames Valley Police. Cllr Reynolds advised that parking enforcement may be helped in the future as Cherwell District Council are going to subcontracting this out.

7. VILLAGE EMERGENCY PLAN, CRIME PREVENTION & ENVIRONMENT – No update

8. PARISH COUNCIL USE OF INTERNET & SOCIAL MEDIA

Cllr Martin will work with Mr Hugh Brooman to develop a new website. The Council expressed thanks to Mr Brooman for all his work and time managing the current website. The Village Hall has requested a link between their website and the new Council website.

9. PLANNING, CLIMATE CHANGE, FINANCE & LEGAL

Cllr Garland would lead gathering of evidence, including a village survey, to enable a comprehensive response to the forthcoming consultation on Cherwell's Local Plan. Cllr Garland is preparing the response to the Oxfordshire 2050 Plan.

10. SPORTS AND SOCIAL CLUB

Insurance - The Cropredy Parish Sports and Social Club had requested that the Parish Council includes their risks could on the Council Policy but the Council insurers have advised that is not possible.

New Management Agreement – The Sports and Social Club has requested a new agreement with the Parish Council as the current one dates back to 1997. The have sent a draft to the Parish Council and it was agreed to form a sub committee to review and agree this.

11. FINANCE

Payments - It was RESOLVED that payments totalling £1,903.58 be authorised. Proposed Cllr Garland, seconded Cllr Johnson.

Unity Trust Bank – the new account has been opened but not all signatories have received letters with their log in details so it was decided to make payments with cheques from the Barclays current account.

Payroll for new Clerk – it was agreed that the new clerk would run the payroll on HM Revenue and Customs software Proposed Clir Garland, seconded Clir Jones.

12. COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT

County Council Priorities – These are changing following the recent elections with a greater focus on green issues and youth.

20mph Limits in Villages – an initiative is being developed to enable villages to implement 20mph speed limits at a lower cost. The moratorium on 20mph limits has been relaxed.

Emergency out of hours number for Highways – An out of hours number has issued. Previously out of hours highways issues were handled by the Police. The Clerk will circulate this to Councillors.

13. DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT

District Council Funding - District Cllr Chapman advised that CDC will experience funding shortages as funding is being taken back from councils to central government.

14. QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE

Celebrations will take place between 2nd to 5th June. Villages are encouraged to mark the event by lighting beacons on 2nd June and a lunch on 5th June. This will be discussed at the next meeting.

15. CHERWELL COMMUNITY GOVERNANCE REVIEW

Cherwell District Council is giving Parish Councils the opportunity to request changes to parish boundaries and parish council names. It was agreed that no changes are required for Cropredy.

16. CORRESPONDENCE

The Clerk had distributed the correspondence as it had been received during the month.

Rubbish by bin along Canal – an email had been received about black sacks dumped by a waste bin which was detached from the post. Cllr Garland had reported it on Fix My Street. The Bin will be reattached to the post and the Clerk will ask CDC to remove the Fly Tipping.

17. ANY OTHER BUSINESS NOT OF A CONFIDENTIAL NATURE – None.

18. ANY MATTERS RAISED BY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

New Dog Bin - A member of the public asked for an additional dog bin to be installed by the rubbish bin on the High Street. This was agreed and it will be ordered by the Clerk.

19. DATE OF THE NEXT MEETING – Monday 11th October 2021

There being no further matters the Chair closed the public meeting at 9.00pm
